

Jim's technical tip by Jim Cannon, MAFCA Technical Director

Keep an Eye on Your Ammeter

Thrifty Henry Ford would only spend the money to put an ammeter in the Model A if he knew it would help you while driving, so get in the habit of keeping an eye on it.

Here's what to look for and what it can tell you:

Watch for the ammeter needle to "twitch" as you pop out the ignition switch or turn the ignition switch to the "on" position. This confirms that the coil is getting power. Now start the car.

After the engine starts and you have it on a fast idle to warm up, check that the ammeter is showing a Charge to the battery. If not, find out why.

Look at the ammeter needle when you step on the brakes. It should jump a bit toward discharge (unless you have LED brake lights installed, which draw very little power). It's always good, before you hit today's crazy, busy roads, to know that your brake lights are working.

If you have a voltage regulator in your generator, or if you have an alternator (which has a voltage regulator built in) then you should see the initial battery charge rate on the ammeter steadily drop until it is back to zero in 5 minutes or less. A stock Model A generator will not do this, it has a constant amps output above idle RPM, so you can watch for that while you drive.

Check the ammeter as you turn your headlights on. The charge rate to the battery should drop with a generator; the needle should jump around a bit but go back to where it was if you are driving with a good alternator.

As you see, the ammeter can help keep you out of trouble every Model A Day!

## Carson Blaydes

Carson was born in Fresno, CA at Fresno County Hospital in 1933. He lived in Sanger before joining the US Navy in 1955. He married Marian in 1956 and while in the Navy they had their first of four sons.

Carson bought his first Model A, a 30' Coupe in 1951 and then a roadster which he had for many years. He had a total of about ten Model A's, ranging from a AA Stake Truck to a Delivery to a Tudor leatherback.

After mustering out of the Navy they moved to L.A. where he worked for B.F. Goodrich until 1962 and then applied and took a position as a Montebello, CA, PD, police officer. He retired in 1989 and moved to their home in Springville atop the hill where Carson now resides.



"Get to Know

Carson restored several Model A's to a Fine Point and received several trophies for all his efforts. He rebuilt a AA Stakebed and in 2001 restored a "Delivery". He also restored his present 1929 Tudor Leatherback also, and has two more A's waiting in the wings, a 1929 Special Coupe and a 1929 Town Sedan. Whew!!!

Carson joined his first Model A Club in 1959 and has belonged to our Club since 1991. He and Marian made several long Tours, one to the 4 Corners (Washington, Oregon, Idaho and Nevada??) The longest trip was 5000 miles. They went to Calgary, Canada and their worst trip was to a Navy reunion in Pascagoula, MS. They were on they're way and in the Panhandle of Florida they had a severe auto accident in they're Model A Sport Coupe. They were rear-ended by another car and they were taken to a hospital where they received minimal treatment and then released. Marian ended up having severe injuries and had to be flown home. Luckily Carson had installed seat belts in this car just before they departed.

Carson and Marian have depended partly on a Model A of one kind or another for their transportation for most of their married lives. One year alone they received an award for driving 14,000 miles in their Model A.


Carson lost Marian in September of 2008.


Carson is what anyone would call a dyed -in-the-wool Model A'er. He is a great person and now a good friend of ours. *Linda and Phil Kneeland*
